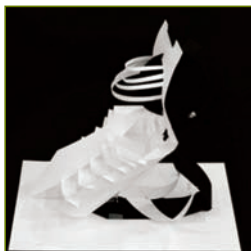

SIXTH ASIAN OLYMPIAD ATTRACTS 1134 FUTURE ARCHITECTS

The international architecture olympics are open to high school students in the **Republic of Korea and Singapore**. This project confrontation aims to recognise the emerging talent of high school students who hope to become architects.

One thousand, one hundred and thirty-four participants took part in this 6th edition of the annual olympics. The students had to develop a 3D interpretation of the **definition of architecture given by German philosopher Hans Georg Gadamer during an interview with architects Herzog and de Meuron**. Kim Hyo Won is this year's grand prize winner for Korea; Chua Shi Yi Fiona is the winner in Singapore.

RESEARCH IN THE SERVICE OF ARCHITECTURAL TEACHING

The UIA is launching an international competition of **research papers that further innovation in architectural teaching**. The competition is organised on behalf of the UIA Architectural Education commission by the Federation of Institutes of Korean Architects (FIKA), the UIA Korean Section.

This competition is open to architects and students of architecture or urban planning that have obtained a diploma corresponding to at least 5 years of university education. The international jury will discern a **grand prize of 1500 euros, two 1000 euro prizes, and three 500 euro prizes**, along with nine honourable mentions. These prizes will be presented during the UIA Tokyo congress in 2011. Competitors are invited to submit **questions** on the competition website until **1st August 2010**.

HONOURS FOR TAY KHEN SOON AND GOH CHONG CHIA

The Malaysian Institute of Architects awarded its 2010 Gold Medal to architect Tay Khen. Founder of **Akitek Tenggara** and member of the SPUR urban planning group, Tay favours climatic and cultural conditions over imported architectural models. He brought to light the specific questions related to **planning for megacities in the tropics** and defined a highly sophisticated and modern language for tropical architectural “**Line, Edge**”, weaving and shadow.

The institute also honoured UIA Treasurer Goh Chong Chia with the title of **honorary lifetime member of PAM**.

ROLANDO BARAHONA RECEIVES JOSE MARIA BARRANTES PRIZE

This biennial prize is awarded by the College of Architects of Costa Rica to a local architect for the excellence of his or her life’s work, and in particular for the capacity to innovate on the theoretical and technological levels. Rolando Barahona received the 2010 prize last May during the **San Juan international architecture biennial**, on the theme of Emerging Architecture.

The jury applauded the depth of his work that seeks its **roots in art, culture, collective memory and social reality**. Rolando Barahona is among the strongest advocates of sustainable architectural design in Costa Rica. In parallel to his architectural practice, he teaches at the University of Costa Rica and directs the architectural magazine **Habitar**. He has also served as president of the Costa Rica National Museum of Arts.
